Updates and Information:

Keystone Exams

- The Winter Keystone Exams will be held December 7th, 8th, and 9th for Biology, Literature, and Algebra I
- HAHS still has yet to receive the official score reports from the Spring 2021 session. Learners and families will receive the official results as soon as they are received (expected mid-December)
- The Winter exams will mostly consist of exam retakes for the Class of 2023 or others retaking the Algebra I exam. These tests are important for the new state graduation requirements
- All learners that will be taking the exams will be notified near the Thanksgiving holiday, and a mailing will be sent to families

• Freshmen HCCTC Field Trip

- On December 7th and 8th, freshmen from HAHS will take a field trip to visit the Huntingdon County Career and Technology Center
- Students will get to visit each of the twelve programs at the HCCTC to see the variety of options offered. Learners will also be treated to lunch at the HCCTC
- These learners did not get to attend a traditional field trip to the HCCTC as 8th graders.
 Therefore, this trip is important so that they get exposure to the programs before the 22-23 scheduling process begins in late winter/early spring
- The HAHS freshmen class will be divided into two groups, with half of the class attending on 12/7, and the other half of the class on 12/8. These two dates make use of days when instruction will already be interrupted due to the administration of the Winter Keystone Exams. The exam retakes will not impact the freshmen class on these days

Grading Updates

- Grades for Marking Period 1 were released via Skyward approximately two weeks ago
- Though grades are to be updated weekly via Skyward, the days prior to our coming breaks, Wednesday, 11/24, and Thursday, 12/23 will serve as checkpoints for MP2 Deficiency notices for learners currently earning a D or an F in a class will be sent to families via the Skyward Family Access portal
- We hope that all students can continue to follow the BEARCATS expectations of Being Engaged and Acting Responsibly, and adhere to assignment guidelines and deadlines in order to facilitate learning and understanding, ultimately resulting in academic success!

HAHS Cell Phone Use Modifications

- o To start the 21-22 School Year, HAHS implemented a strict no cell phone policy
- The implementation of the new procedures helped in creating an atmosphere of greater focus and attention during instructional time, and has drawn awareness to the need of not needing to be "connected" to a phone device continuously
- However, the HAHS staff also shared the unintended consequences of the new procedure with school administrations, particularly during non-instructional times and when a personal device has merit within the classroom. With this information, modified procedures have been established, with overwhelming staff support
- The procedures were shared during a principal assemblies this week, and teachers shared their updated classroom expectations
- Though there is great flexibility overall, note that students must follow the expectations that teachers set in their individual classrooms, and that the same procedures for violations will remain in place
- A listing of the information that was shared with students can be viewed in the APPENDIX
- In addition, a shift to focusing on the proper use of cell phones as technology and etiquette practices will be explored

 - o There is not "passive permission"






Cell Phone Update
