

#### Remote Learning Expectations Google Classroom Post

Good morning,

As we approach the holiday break, please note the following reminders and updates:

1. Do you best to get caught up prior to the holiday break.

There will be a Positive School Wide drawing for learners earning Bearcash cards prior to the break. We are focusing on the positive behaviors of attending live sessions and assignment completion.

Focusing on these areas will continue after our break until the end of the first semester too. There will be another Bearcash drawing in January.
