The CTI at Hiram G. Andrews is one of eight schools of its kind in the nation offering individualized, affordable education and training options for students.

Students also came together to sign a Unity Day poster that will be proudly displayed in our hallways as a reminder to stand united against bullying, and to celebrate the power of community. Students in Mr. Young's Engineering class completed a Rube Goldberg project. They were tasked with having all 6 simple machines that they learned about interact together to accomplish a task. Some of the tasks included: making lemonade, chopping wood, trapping and killing rodents, and a gender reveal.









The Honors Physics I classes completed their first quarter engineering project. Their task was to build a model rocket using whatever means of thrust they wanted (except for model rocket engines) and then record the telemetry of the launch. All teams used water and pressurized air to provide thrust. They were able to collect the velocities and accelerations for their rockets using Bluetooth capable altimeters and their Chromebooks. After the launch date, they completed an engineering report outlining the steps taken to build and test their rockets. They also needed to calculate the forces acted on the rocket. Finally, they needed to propose changes to their rockets to improve performance if they were to relaunch. The team of Sophia Davigon, Emilie Hayden, Lydia Stapleton, and Solomon Ferrenberg had the most successful launch of approximately 140 feet in the air.





Art students traveled to St. Francis to learn basic hand drumming techniques with Jim Donovan and got a taste of Neurographic Art with Assistant Professor of Visual Arts, Jess Campbell. Emilie Hayden and Maggie Linn were able to submit their designs to the 4th Annual "Poppies Project."







Students in Mrs. Ryan's Spanish classes have been celebrating Día de los Muertos. They have done a variety of activities such as creating sugar skulls. The sugar skulls represent the souls of departed loved ones who are being remembered by families throughout Latin America. Mrs. Ryan also set up an "ofrenda" display in the hallway which is a replica of what families put in their homes each year to give food, drinks, and small treats to their loved ones.
