
The students were able to compare and contrast the festival to how they celebrate New Years in the United States.






Military Knowledge




Spaced Learning Over Time

Homework Help

Skyward/Family Access

Family Access is an excellent resource to keep up to date on your studnt's academic progress, and we encourage you to access it regularly.

What I Need (WIN)

WIN is a built-in support period that gives students time for extra help, skill practice, or structured study hall, depending on their needs. WIN is Period 1 for 6th grade and Period 6 for 7th and 8th grade.
